

Our Ned


The time has come to address a few issues concerning the fabric of our much loved and well used Church.

Like most buildings of its age, essential repairs are necessary to preserve the fabric of the building, for example:

- heating and lighting systems needs updating
- the pews are badly infected with woodworm
- the wooden pew base/platforms have started to break apart.

This is an opportunity to consider reordering our only community building for the congregation and community by providing:

- a more comfortable place of worship whilst preserving the church
- an adaptable community meeting space for the active community
- a building to contribute towards climate change mitigation



Reorder Group

The Butlers Marston Church Restoration & Reorder Group is a working group of the Parochial Church Council and the Parish Council and acts in a purely advisory capacity reporting back. Our aim is:

- regular consultation with the community and key stakeholders
- identify suitability and costs for renewable energy sources
- outline the likely & suitable sources of funding
- develop scope of works and costs of employing architects

Utilising both organisations we can approach both secular and non-secular funding options and have the support of local district council and our County Councillor, Chris Mills.


Church Visits

Mission



Vision

Through faith and guidance provide a haven of peace, learning, solace and enjoyment for our community away from a world of uncertainty.

Public Consultation

- The general theme from respondents was that the church reorder should bringing the community closer together
- 33% of the parish responded, 100% agree there is a need to reorder the church to provide a community space.
- Heating, seating & a kitchen are the top requirements
- Maintaining all the religious facilities was important
- Path lighting and improving the churchyard path were important to respondents.
- Floor space and storage requirements high is demand
- 81% of respondents gave future activity suggestions.
- · Support for lighting the Church Tower but not all the time
- Energy efficiency important to many respondents
- Interest from groups about the new space as there is potential limited capacity locally for groups & meetings
- Keen to keep current toilet facilities





Butlers Marston Church is the ideal location to bring the community together. Following our reorder project we hope to be able to provide the following facilities:

- Church retreat with champing facilities
- Concerts & Performances
- Modern conference and variety of meeting spaces
- Chapel facilities
- Catering facilities for MMU, Harvest Supper, Village Breakfast, BH Teas
- Emergency Response Centre
- Local political center for polling station, council meetings
- Open space for exhibitions and attractions
- Space for local groups




Church Retreat

Butlers Marston Church is the ideal location to welcome guests on retreat or courses, as well as those who seek some space for quiet or study. Following our reorder project we hope to be able to provide the following facilities:

- modern conference and variety of meeting spaces
- chapel facilities
- champing facilities
- easy access and ample parking
- community events and activities
- local walks and country pubs nearby





Pew Findings

- Pews were first generally introduced into the church in the latter half of the 18th century.
- Before this time churches were generally bare internally with seating likely to be on the perimeter of what was an open hall.
- The current church pew installation dates from mid/late19th century.
- The pews and their decking are in a poor condition and require significant restoration and/or replacement.
- Historically, the pews in the church are not believed to be significant in that they are of a standard design from that time.
- The proposed flexible use of the church going forward does not support the retention of the current layout.
- A few pews should be included in the reordering, utilising a complimentary style that is more comfortable and made movable to suit the flexibility need.

Areas to Consider

As part of the reorder program we need to consider all areas of the church, specifically looking at:

- Sources of heating:
 - Underfloor heating (all electric or wet)
 - Radiant heating (tubes, Infra-red, panels, radiators, air)
 - Traditional space heating
 - Heat pumps
 - Ground source
- Adaptable lighting for different building uses inside and outside the church
- Religious focus/ambience (respect for historical inclusion and continuity.
- Use/Layout flexibility
- Insulation considerations
- Energy generation such as solar and batteries
- Futureproofing audio visual technology





Eco Church

In February 2020 the Church of England adopted the aim of achieving net zero carbon by 2030. Butlers Marston Church aims to deliver this through our reorder project and have already started to make progress on this. The design and construction of the proposalswill respect the need's of sustainability.

We registered and submitted our first survey in April 2019. We submitted an updated survey in Feb 2024. We have made some progress, and have achieved Gold standard for "worship and teaching" and Bronze for "land" and "lifestyle".



Project Funding

Once the reorder project is approved by the PCC and DAC we will need to look at multiple funding opportunities from both secular and non-secular sources.





Existing Plan




Existing Section


Proposed Plan






